TOPIC

Bedside to bench: clinical learnings in probable CTE



Chronic traumatic encephalopathy (CTE) is a neurodegenerative tauopathy linked to repetitive head impacts, presenting as traumatic encephalopathy syndrome - mood, behaviour and cognition. This talk connects bedside presentation to neuropathology, the limits of current in-vivo criteria, and the neuropsychiatric care of probable CTE.

Telling normal age-related change from the earliest signs of neurodegeneration is a core neuropsychiatric skill. This talk covers the neuropsychiatric symptoms of ageing - affective and behavioural change - how to assess them, and when new-onset symptoms such as mild behavioural impairment herald emergent dementia.
